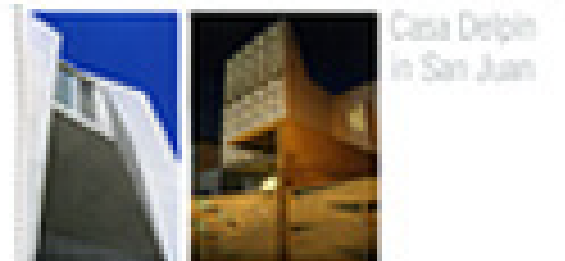
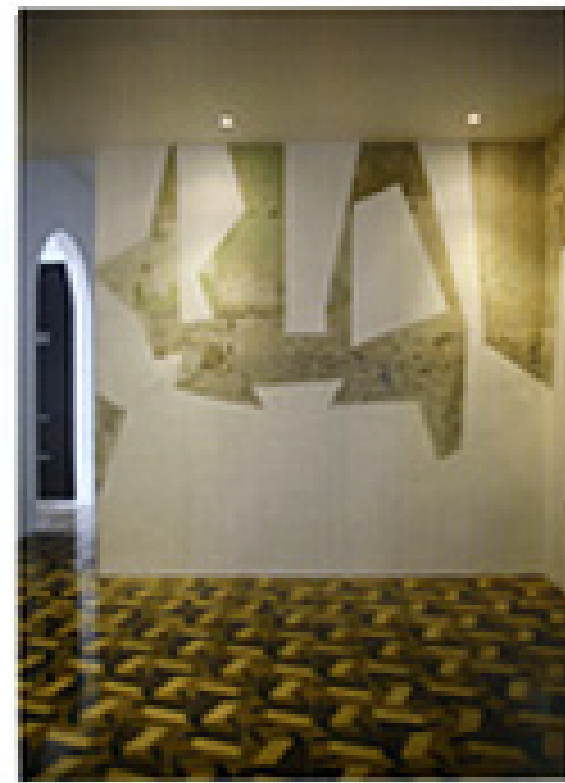
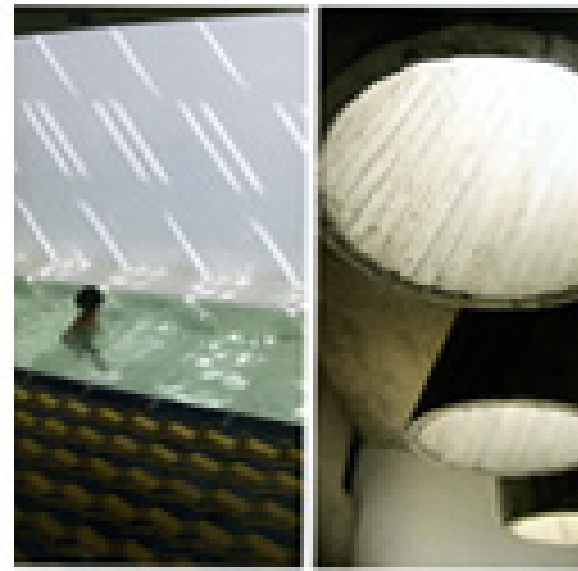

Casa Delphin in San Juan

The Casa Delphin in San Juan, Puerto Rico, is a residential building designed by A.A. Studio, Fuster + Partners, Zecc Architekten, Sami Rintala, Herzog & de Meuron, Chris Tate, Berschneider + Berschneider, and Christa Fischer. The building is characterized by its white, ribbed, spherical structure, which is a central element of the design. The structure is made of a material that resembles a woven fabric or a series of overlapping layers, creating a complex, organic form. The building is situated in a coastal area, and the design is inspired by the local architecture and the surrounding environment. The interior of the building features a patterned carpet and a large, abstract, white sculpture hanging from the ceiling.
